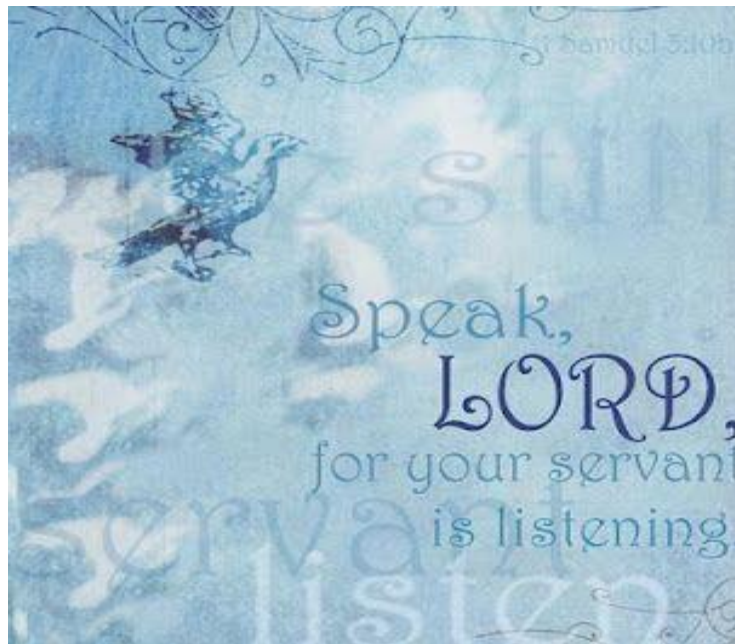

From the Health Team: WILL YOU TAKE THE COVID VACCINE?

When I am asked whether I will take the Covid vaccine, my response is that I will accept it at the first opportunity. As a physician working in a nursing home, I may actually have that opportunity before the end of December.

As Christians, we believe that we should care for our bodies as our temples and care for one another as ourselves. Keeping social distance, wearing masks, and taking the vaccine when it is available are ways to do this during the era of Covid.

The development of this vaccine in record-breaking time is a testimony to God's gift of intellect and great collaboration among many scientists, using techniques of vaccine development. The mRNA vaccine does not contain even an inactivated virus, so it cannot transmit the virus. The initial trials are very promising, and adverse effects so far have been infrequent. The Pfizer and Moderna vaccines have had remarkable rates of suppressing infection. Over time, we hope to find that vaccination also reduces the severity of illness in individuals who do become infected, as does the flu vaccine (You have had your flu shot, haven't you?). Most reactions have been mild aches and pains, malaise, lowgrade fever, much like those of the flu vaccine. Rarely, in individuals who have a history of severe allergies, there have been more severe, but not life-threatening, reactions. Will more side effects become evident over time? --very possibly, but the risk of death from Covid is a greater risk. We don't yet know how long the immunity lasts after the vaccine; only time and experience will tell. We don't know yet whether we will have to have boosters in subsequent years. BUT this is a start, and I urge all of you to roll up your sleeves and accept the vaccine when your turn comes!

In the meantime, please be safe. Continue social distance and mask-wearing until the experts tell us it is safe to stop hiding from the virus.

Stewardship Journey

Last year has proven to be quite a challenge in our church life due to COVID-19, but your continued support and generosity during these past several months has helped us continue our ministry in worship, teaching and compassion, and being a church that is the Body of Christ.

Join friends of Golden Hill church to follow Jesus' footsteps on the road to Jerusalem and the cross. This Lenten study guide includes seven weeks of meditations. Each daily devotion includes a scripture reading from the Gospel of Luke and an African Proverb or other sayings. Weekly themes include: Prayer, Fasting, Almsgiving, Bible Study, Service and Gratitude.



Our seven-week study begins Monday evenings at 7 pm via Zoom on February 15th or on Sunday mornings via teleconference at 9:15 am on February 21st.
